- 2. Click the right pointing arrow next to the month
- 3. Look at calendar month

- 6. Enter the updated habit name

- 8. Enter the updated monthly goal
- 9. Click the "Save" button
- 10. Look at the data shown

- 1. Log in to the website
- 2. Have a habit created or in account already
- 3. Hover over the habit name
- 4. Click the trash can for deleting
- 5. A pop up will ask if you are sure to delete the habit
- 6. Click "Yes, Delete"
- 7. Look at the data shown
